As we're approaching the end of the first half term of the academic year, I wanted to give you a brief update of what we've been working on in school.

As a staff team we meet each week to take part in training and discussion around school development priorities. We have focused on ensuring we have a very consistent approach towards behaviour management. We aim to be relentlessly positive, but also to ensure all children are aware of our expectations which are focused around the 'golden rules'. This is to ensure we have a calm, safe and positive learning environment for all.

We are also starting to look at our curriculum and planning some exciting curriculum events which we think will really engage and excite the children. We're starting with an 'Aspirations' week in the second half of this term and we look forward to sharing news about this and how you might want to get involved.

SLAPPED CHEEK/ FIFTH DISEASE

We recently have had a number of cases of 'slapped cheek' which is a virus common in children. Symptoms include a high temperature, a runny nose, sore throat and headache. A rash may appear after a few days and usually fades in 1 to 3 weeks. Once the rash appears, it is no longer infectious. We ask that if your child has a temperature and appears unwell they stay at home.

LEARNING REVIEWS

There will be a creche for school-aged children during the Learning Reviews on Wednesday 23rd October. This will be held in the hall. Face to face meetings will be in your child's classroom and we politely request that parents keep to the ten minutes per appointment to avoid long delays for other parents. Thank you for your cooperation with this.

As it is early in the year, the teachers won't be sharing books, but will be talking about how your child has settled and how you can support them. There will be an Open Afternoon in the spring term where you'll be able to see your child's books.


