We welcomed the Government's announcement in March 2023 confirming that the government were committing over £600 million across the next two academic years (2023-24 & 2024-25) for the continuation of the Primary PE and Sport Premium — a funding commitment to improve the quality of PE and sports in primary schools to help children benefit from regular activity.

At Ravenbank, the funding ensures that we prioritise children's physical wellbeing, help children get an active start in life and supports the quality of our PE and sport provision.
