#### Dear Parents & Carers,

I hope you had a pleasant half term. As we approach our second half term, I asked for an update from the council regarding the progress of the relaying of the cobbles at the end of Pepper Street. The below is their response:

'The sett laying is a very specialised skill requiring the sorting of setts for appropriate size prior to laying to ensure compatible widths, to enable the linear bond to be achieved. Specialist materials are needed for bedding and jointing of setts. Wet weather will severely affect the bedding material and jointing in the same way as brickwork in a wall.



We are regularly checking the traffic management and alternative routes. We have listened to concerns from residents, and others, and have continued to amend the traffic management to improve effectiveness. We now have the right balance, but this will continue to be monitored throughout the works.

We do appreciate that a major project of this nature will be disruptive. However, we assure everyone affected that we are constantly checking works and improvement have been made to ensure completion of works as soon as possible, and, weather permitting, we are anticipating that the Pepper Street will be reopened to traffic from the village end around the end of November/beginning of December.

We would like to thank everyone for their continued support and patience during the progress of your environmental improvement project on Pepper Street.'

Thank you for your patience. We will continue to keep the register open until 9.20am whilst the roadworks are on-going, but we are pleased to say that the majority of children are in school promptly each morning. Thank you for your support with this.

## ATTENDANCE

Over the holiday, I have been reviewing the overall and individual attendance figures. As part of our trust policy for Attendance, it is my responsibility to communicate with parents and carers around their child's attendance and follow up on any incidents of persistent poor attendance. I am pleased to report that the overall attendance figure is 97%, which is well above national averages. Thank you for your support in ensuring your child is in school regularly and on time.

New government guidance around attendance is much stricter and I cannot authorise absences which haven't been properly explained, birthdays or holidays in term time unless there is an exceptional circumstance. We understand that there will be occasions that circumstances mean you need to take your child out of school, but this will appear as 'unauthorised' on your child's attendance record.

If you need to request an absence, we ask that this is done on School Spider and if your child is unwell you can either inform us via School Spider or by calling the school office by 9am. We also ask that parents request that medical or dental appointments are made outside of school hours but understand that this isn't always possible.

## MENTAL HEALTH & WELLBEING



We hope you've noticed the new banner outside school. Next week with the children we are launching the NHS endorsed program, My Happy Mind. The program helps children to understand how their brain works and supports them in developing positive skills and habits to be their very best selves!


We want parents to be fully involved in the program and we would like to invite you in for a presentation to learn more on **Friday 15th November at 9am** (in the school hall) with Miss Green, who is leading the initiative for us. There will also be a parent video available after the session. You can download the My Happy Mind App or log in here: https://myhappymind.org/ . Please use code **148457** to access resources.

There is also a competition that parents can enter on the app and win resources for the school.

Last half term we introduced our 'zones of regulation' to the children. The zones are designed to teach children about the full range of their feelings. Feelings are complicated, they come in different sizes and levels of energy that effect our bodies in different ways. Small children may not understand the link between the physical sensations in their bodies and the feelings. By using a simple common language, we can support children when they move in and out of the different zones.

At Ravenbank, in each classroom there are pots for each colour and the children put a lolly stick with their name on in the pot that best describes how they are feeling. This allows the adults in the classroom to spot children who may be feeling sad, anxious or angry and take some time to support them. You can find out more by watching this video:
